



PERMIT

Section 45.1.0, Traffic Control Bylaw 2677/G/23

Unless a Person has first obtained the written authorization from the Town, or unless otherwise permitted by any Town bylaw, no Person shall place, erect, maintain or cause to be placed or maintained on, over, or projection into any Highway, Sidewalk, or Boulevard anything which obstructs the free use of such Highway, Sidewalk or Boulevard. This applies to items including, but not limited to, a doorstep, porch, railing, awning, trees, shrubs, or shipping containers.

*** Please note that if you have a driveway that can fit your unit you will not be granted a permit unless there is a valid reason to not have it placed onto the driveway.**

Planning a move or remodel?

If you are planning a move or a big home renovation you may have considered renting an intermodal shipping container for storing your valuables or collecting debris from your renovation. You may require a permit under the Traffic Bylaw

General Information:

- If you are planning on placing your bin on your driveway or if the bin can fit at the rear of the property (without encroaching alleyway access) you are not required to obtain a permit. If the container fits on your property, you may not receive permission to place the bin on the roadway without reason. However, if placing the bin on the roadway is your only option, a permit is required before placing the bin on the street.
- Please allow time to process your application, permit applications must be submitted a minimum of 2 weeks prior to your anticipated bin placement date, otherwise your application will not be approved. You may submit your application by email to enforcement@stonyplain.com or you may drop it off in person at the Town Office located at 4905 51 Avenue.
- Some locations may require a Traffic Accommodation Plan to manage the free movement of pedestrian or vehicle traffic. You may be required to submit this with your permit application for review. You may be contacted by Enforcement Staff if necessary.
- Consider your proposed location and size of the container. If the bin is too close to an intersection or to your neighbor's driveway, this will impact the safety of the road. A moving container takes up much more room than a car.
- Consider making your bin more visible to general traffic by use of road pylons, flags or reflectors
- Placing landscape materials and moving bins on the street often limit the available parking in your neighborhood, especially cul-de-sacs. Please be considerate of your neighbors when considering a rental.
- Street sweeping, and snow removal schedules are considered when applications are reviewed
