#### **BACKGROUND**

Skydancer Indigenous Cultural Society was born in the spirit of Truth and Reconciliation. The Society supports the revival of vibrant, talented, and creative Indigenous voices and provides a gathering place and showroom for culture bearers to share Indigenous ways of knowing and the arts with everyone. Skydancer Indigenous Cultural Centre is a gathering place that is welcoming to all and consists of an office, meeting area, and gallery displaying a curated selection of paintings, jewellery, ceramics, books, clothing and handmade craft.

The Town provides annual operational funding to the Skydancer Indigenous Cultural Society with the current memorandum of agreement set at \$20,000 for 2025 and 2026.




### Our growth



**SUBJECT**: Yellowhead West Pickleball Club

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Carol Buzzell, President and Carey Clarke, Vice President of Yellowhead West Pickleball Club will present to Council the Yellowhead West Pickleball Club highlights as well as plans they have for the 2025-2026 season.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Yellowhead West Pickleball Club is a community organization that promotes and operates a pickleball program based out of Stony Plain. Current programming occurs on seven courts in the Heritage Park Pavilion from mid-September until May.

As of February 2025, an estimated 1.54 million Canadians are playing pickleball, representing a 57% increase in participation since 2022. The most significant growth has been among adults aged 35–54.

The Yellowhead West Pickleball Club, established in 2018 to secure winter indoor playing space for local players, has experienced rapid growth. Last season, the club registered 375 members and continues to expand its reach through partnerships and grants that support youth programs, skill development clinics, and other initiatives. In recognition of its success, Yellowhead West was named 2024 Club of the Year by Pickleball Alberta.

Looking ahead, facilities for the sport will continue to grow in Stony Plain. In spring 2026, four new outdoor courts will open south of the outdoor pool, and by late 2026, the Recreation Centre will feature four dedicated indoor courts. These additions will compliment the private pickleball development currently underway in the North Industrial Park.




